Linking you with community services and activities to improve your health and wellbeing

What is Social Prescribing?

Social Prescribing is a free service through your GP that puts you in touch with a wide range of local activities to support you and improve your wellbeing.

How can Social Prescribing help me?

Social Prescribing can link you up to social or physical activities in your community and could help if you are experiencing any of the following:

- Feeling lonely or socially isolated
- Looking for more social contact
- Stress or depression
- Anxiety and lacking confidence
- Dementia
- Wanting to improve physical health
- Long-term health conditions
- Needing practical support and information to improve your situation







What happens after a referral is made?

Your Social Prescribing Link Worker will contact you to talk about your concerns and the factors affecting your health. Your Link Worker will then help you identify and organise assistance through the council, community and voluntary organisations that are available locally.

What local services might I be signposted to?

- Physical wellbeing e.g. exercise / balance classes
- Social Centres for the community
- Advice and information
- Mental wellbeing
- Housing advice and adaptations
- Council services
- Leisure services
- Community groups
- Befriending schemes

- Increased fitness

How do I get a referral?
