Statement of Common Ground

This Statement of Common Ground (SoCG) is between Epsom & Ewell Borough Council (EEBC) and NHS Surrey Heartlands Integrated care Board (SHICB) in relation to the Epsom & Ewell Local Plan 2040.

1) Constituent parties to this SOCG

Epsom & Ewell Borough Council (EEBC) NHS Surrey Heartlands (SHICB)

2) Background

This SOCG sets out the agreed position as at May 2025 in relation to primary healthcare matters and Epsom and Ewell Borough Council's (EEBC) Proposed Submission Local Plan.

The Borough of Epsom & Ewell is within the Surrey Heartlands Health & Care Partnership, an Integrated Care System, which is a partnership of health organisations, local authorities and others. The Surrey Heartlands ICB (part of the ICS) is a statutory NHS organisation responsible for developing a plan for meeting the health needs of the population, managing the local NHS budget and arranging for the provision of health services in ICS area.

3) Local Plan engagement and outcomes

EEBC has engaged with SHICB during the preparation of the Local Plan. This has included engagement on the evidence base, specifically modelling the anticipated impact of the Proposed Submission Local Plan on primary healthcare provision, to inform the Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP). SHICB were consulted at the Regulation 18 and 19 formal consultation stages. SHICB Details of this are provided below:

Regulation 18 Draft Local Plan

SHICB responded to the Regulation 18 consultation on the 11th April 2023. A copy of the full response can be provided by EEBC upon request. The main areas of comment are summarised below:

Infrastructure delivery: SHICB were supportive of the draft policy and encourages EEBC to continue to engage with health providers. EEBC should continue to seek S106 and CIL contributions for health services and collaborate through the IDP.

Affordable housing: SHICB emphasised the need to make provision for affordable housing for key workers.

Healthy design: SHICB suggested further consideration on healthy design which recognises the wider determinants of health and promotes healthy and green lifestyle choices through well designed places.

Input and engagement on the Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP) and draft Proposed Submission Local Plan policies

EEBC worked with SHICB on the IDP, with SHICB outlining that the current GP surgeries operate within two Primary Care Networks (PCN): Epsom PCN and ICP PCN. EEBC and SHICB worked to identify the potential impact of housing growth on primary healthcare general practice infrastructure within the borough using SHICB's chosen healthcare planning model. SHICB identified that additional floorspace need to be delivered, through works to existing facilities or where appropriate new buildings. The outputs identified estimated financial contributions that would be sought through developer contributions (S106 and/or CIL) and helped inform the identification of potential schemes to address this impact, which were subsequently included in the IDP. These comprise:

The potential extension/re-development/ re-configuration of the sites: Old Cottage Hospital, Shadbolt Park House and Bourne Hall Health Centre to provide additional capacity over the plan period, subject to feasibility. These fall within the Epsom PCN and ICP PCNs.

EEBC liaised with SHICB over the wording of policy SA35 Land at Horton Farm, to ensure the allocation provides additional primary care capacity required to serve local needs. The policy would deliver the SHICB's requirements while providing flexibility.

Regulation 19 Proposed Submission Local Plan

The Regulation 19 Proposed Submission Local Plan consultation was undertaken from 20 December 2024 to 5 February 2025. SHICB provided a positive response which is provided in Appendix 1.

4) Positions of the parties

Both parties agree:

- EEBC and SHICB have worked constructively throughout the Local Plan process to identify the impact of the Proposed Submission Local Plan on primary healthcare infrastructure and how this may be mitigated.

The Consultation Statement (December 2024) published alongside the submission version renects our comments, and we note the Council's commitment to continue to engage with Infrastructure providers and update the Infrastructure Delivery Plan as necessary. We are pleased to see that the submission version of the plan retains the requirement that all new development must contribute towards to provision of Infrastructure, via onsite provision of off-site financial contributions, and welcome the specific reference to health facilities in paragraph 8.L we support the overall approach to infrastructure delivery in Policy S17 and consider that it provides an effective framework for oosuring that development proposals will make provision to meet the cost of healthcare infrastructure made necessary by the development.
