
- Joining the Roman army

## LOAN BOXES

The free loan box service is offered to illustrate various historical topics studied within KS1 and KS2. Boxes include a combination of original artefacts from the museum's collections and reproduction items designed to illustrate some of the earlier periods of history. Boxes may be borrowed free of charge for up to half a term at a time.

### ROMANS



Boxes contain a selection of pots, tiles, brooches, lamps, writing equipment and finds from local archaeological digs.

There are 8 boxes available for loan.

### TUDORS

Learn how the Tudors lived. Our boxes include kitchen utensils, pots, clay pipes and items of clothing such as ruffs and shoes.

There are 4 boxes available for loan.



## VICTORIANS



Choose from boxes covering Victorian costume, home or school.

Discover what they wore, how they used abacus' and what their hot water bottles were like.

There are 13 boxes available for loan.

## 1930s

Illustrate home life in the 1930s. Our boxes contain a selection of cameras, games, magazines and kitchen utensils.

There are 4 boxes available for loan.



## WORLD WAR 2



Explore life in WW2 using gas masks, ration books, shrapnel and shell cases, newspapers, helmets and more.

There are 6 boxes available for loan.

## TOYS



Discover how toys have changed through time using our boxes containing a variety of toys from the 1900s to the 1950s.

There are 3 boxes available for loan.
